Dear Neighbor,

Pittsburgh Regional Transit (PRT) began rehabilitating 18 high-platform stations along our light rail system in February. The two-year project has been divided into four phases.

The High Platform Station Improvement Project includes removing and replacing concrete from the platform edges, replacing the tactile ADA pads, and sanding and painting the canopies and railings. Stations will also receive some cosmetic upgrades including new lighting, benches, and trash receptacles.

Phase One began in February 2022, and included Fallowfield, Potomac, and Mt. Lebanon Stations. Phase One is nearly complete and the contractor is preparing to start Phase Two.

Phase Two is expected to begin on August 29, 2022, and will include the following stations:

- Willow/Overbrook Junction (at the same time)
- Washington Junction
- Castle Shannon

The contractor will be working Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Weekends may be used as make-up days, and when single track operation is required to limit disruption to riders. Weekend work hours would remain the same.

Once the contractor has mobilized at all four stations, they may move between stations within this phase. Work on these stations is expected to take about six months.
