### Yard Waste Disposal Pilot Program

### Summer 2024

We are happy to announce that the Borough of Castle Shannon will be launching a new yard waste disposal program beginning in July. Collections will take place on the Third Saturday of each month between July-October.

**ACCEPTED**: Limbs, branches, bush branches/trimmings, grass clippings and leaves. Grass clippings and leaves must be in paper leaf bags (available at all local hardware stores).

**NOT ACCEPTED**: Household trash, bulk waste, construction waste, or yard waste in plastic bags.

### Residents must register by 4:00pm on the preceding Wednesday of collection.

Residents may register by calling or emailing the Borough Offices at csboro@csboro.org or 412-885-9200.

Please have your materials placed at the curb (not in the street) before 7:00 a.m. on the pickup day. You may not place your materials for collection on the curb before 4:00 p.m. the day before collection. All collected materials will be processed at a commercial composting facility.

#### **Collection Dates**

- July 20th must be registered on or before July 17th by 4:00pm.
- August 17th must be registered on or before August 14th by 4:00pm.
- September 21st must be registered on or before September 18th by 4:00pm.
- October 19th must be registered on or before October 16th by 4:00pm.


## Library Events


Crafternoon & Crafterdark Wednesday, July 24th at 1:30PM-3:30PM or 6:30PM-8:30PM (Special Date)
